ACORN CLASS

Some of the children in Acorn Class made some beautiful poppies using red leaves. These are now part of our Remembrance Display. In Design Technology the children tasted some fruit and vegetables to see which the liked or disliked.









HORSE CHESTNUT CLASS

The children in Horse Chestnut Class completed their Science unit on life cycles by creating posters to show the development of eggs to caterpillars and then butterflies. They have benefitted from seeing objects up close using microscopes on loan from the British Microscope Society.

In English, they have been inspired by a 'global explorer's rucksack' and have written about places and environments they would like to visit. This marks the start of our latest book, 'Dear Earth'.



SYCAMORE CLASS

Sycamore have settled back into school fabulously well after their week off. In English they have been learning about how to write both informal and formal text, and in maths they have been simplifying fractions. Our PE sessions this week were fantastic and the children are really showing their determination and enthusiasm in lessons. We had a particular fun starting our new dodgeball unit!
