ACORN CLASS

Year 1 have been busy learning how to use a part whole model to split a number, while Reception children have been learning how to subitise the numbers 1, 2 and 3. In English, we have finished reading our first book and the Year 1 children have written their own story and published these in their own personal books.



HORSECHESTNUT CLASS

The children in Horse Chestnut Class designed their own Dragon Machines in English. They have written detailed descriptions of the main character, George's, flight to take the troublesome dragons to the safety of the wilderness. In RE, the children created their own body sculptures inspired by the reconciliation statue outside Coventry Cathedral. The Year 3 and 4 French group have been following oral instructions in French to make finger puppets. They then followed a rhyme using the kitten puppets and practiced the greetings learned in previous lessons. - Bravo!



SYCAMORE CLASS

In science this term, the children have been learning all about the states of matter. We have explored how we can change matter from a gas, to a liquid to a solid. To support this learning, we did an experiment to see what temperatures different solids turned to liquid. We experimented with cheese, chocolate, coconut oil and butter carefully using fire to raise the temperature and measure at what temperature the material turned to liquid. Our results were very interesting! Ask you children about what they found out!
