SCHOOL NOTICE BOARD



'Protective Behaviours' - is a safety awareness programme which builds confidence and resilience by exploring our right to feel safe. It teaches children to recognise when they are not feeling safe and practical ways to take action and get help if they need it. Your child/children will have come home with a leaflet this week for you to read. All of the children received their first lesson on this subject, where the children named 5 safe adults they could talk safely to, one for each finger on their hand.

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Please remember that we adhere to a strict 'No Nuts in School' policy. Therefore, any food brought into school must NOT contain traces of ANY nuts. Please check food labels before packing your children's lunches and snacks.

Pupil Data - It is very important that all pupil data is current and up to date. This includes medical and dietary information and up to date contact details for parents, carers and family members. Please keep us informed of any changes to your child/children's data to ensure that everything on your child/children's profile is accurate. An inhaler expiry report is kept securely in the office; please remember to keep us updated with any changes to your child's inhaler or asthma condition.

PE - Acorns every Monday and Thursday, Horse Chestnut and Sycamore class every Tuesday and Thursday. For new parents, this means children come to school in their PE kits (white PE t-shirt, dark shorts/joggers/leggings and dark school pumps or dark trainers) on their PE days.

FOREST SCHOOLS - for <u>Acorns and Horse Chestnut Classes</u> will be every Thursday. For new parents, this means long sleeved top, full-length bottoms, wellies and a raincoat/anorak.

READING - Sharing a book with your child makes a big difference to your child's education. I have re-attached the 'top tips for reading with you child at home'.
