

# Curriculum Overview Autumn 2025

# **Acorns Class**

## English

#### **Phonics**

Will be taught daily using the Monster Phonics scheme to teach new phonemes (sounds) and graphemes (written letters). This will improve the blending of sounds for reading and segmenting words for spelling.

In addition "high frequency words (HFW)" and "common exception words (CEW) will be introduced to help both reading and spelling.

#### Writing

We will develop our writing through the use of complete texts where a story (or nonfiction book) is shared and aspects of the writing skills discussed and practised before application in independent writing using "Drawing Club" or the "Writing Root" from Literacy Tree curriculum

#### Reading

We will develop decoding skills, fluency and reading comprehension through individual, guided reading and whole class comprehension lessons using the "Literacy leaf" from the Literacy Tree curriculum scheme of work.

Books with structured phonics for your child's level will be sent home.

### Art & Design

We will explore making mark with wax, felt tips, chalk and pencils.

We will then explore lines and shapes in pictures for portrait drawing, adding colour to a drawing using control and pressure skills.

To finish, we will create an artist inspired artwork using lines and shapes.

### **PSHE**
