the next few weeks.








Horse Chestnut Class Year 2, 3 & 4

In Computing, Horse Chestnut Class have been combining direction keys and distances to make a turtle character move along a chosen route. They can now write instructions for a series of steps and have written code to match their own stories.







In Science, the children have changed the shape of objects by bending, stretching, twisting and squashing, and have carried out tests to find the most stretchy material.




