Our Vision for PE and Sport at Loxley Primary School

PE and sport at Loxley brings our school vision—"I have set you an example that you should do as I have done"—to life. Through physical activity, children are encouraged to set a good example for themselves and others, aim high in their personal achievements, show courage when trying new skills, and support one another through teamwork and fair play. In this way, PE helps children develop not only physical skills but also character, resilience, and the confidence to lead active, healthy lives.

Our school values are embedded throughout PE and sport: children learn **respect** for themselves and others, develop a sense of **community**, practise **forgiveness** when mistakes happen, hold onto **hope** to keep improving, demonstrate **perseverance** when faced with challenges, and build **trust** in themselves and their peers.

Through a broad and inclusive PE curriculum, we aim to foster lifelong healthy habits, a love of physical activity, and the confidence to lead active lives beyond school.

What is the PE and Sport Premium?

The PE and Sport Premium is government funding provided to primary schools to improve the quality of PE, physical activity, and sport. The aim of the funding is to ensure that all children develop healthy lifestyles, experience a wide range of sports, and gain the skills and confidence to participate in physical activity both during and beyond the school day. At Loxley, we use the PE and Sport Premium to enhance our PE provision through investment in high-quality teaching, specialist coaching, resources, extra-curricular clubs, competitive opportunities, and initiatives designed to promote active play and wellbeing. The funding also supports the development of sustainable improvements so that the benefits for pupils continue well beyond the current year.

Key Achievements to Date

- **Expanded access to a wide variety of competitive and inclusive sports events**, including athletics, dodgeball, and archery.
- **Supported participation in extra-curricular opportunities and competitions**, including top-up swimming lessons for pupils needing additional assistance, and provision of specialist equipment and resources for children with SEND.
- **Enhanced opportunities for girls**, through specialist-focused activities, access to competitions, and provision of specialist equipment and resources.
- **Subsidised sport and physical activity clubs** to ensure access for disadvantaged pupils.
- **Improved pupil outcomes and engagement in PE and sport**, including:
 - Increased attainment in PE
 - Higher levels of physical activity among pupils
 - Greater participation in school sport and extra-curricular activities
 - Increased involvement of staff in extra-curricular clubs and school sports competitions
 - Improved attainment in swimming and water safety
