Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to share the results of our recent parent survey and would like to thank all families who took the time to provide their valuable feedback.

The survey results demonstrate a very positive view of the experiences children have at Loxley CofE Primary School. We are particularly pleased to report that 100% of respondents said they would recommend the school to other parents.

In addition, 93% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child feels safe and happy at school, and 93% agreed that their child is being prepared for the next stage of their learning. Parents also expressed confidence in the school's response to concerns, with 93% agreeing that when concerns are raised, they are dealt with properly.

A number of other areas also received strong positive feedback. 86% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the school ensures good behaviour, has high expectations for pupils, provides an engaging curriculum, makes decisions with children's best interests at heart, communicates effectively with families, and responds quickly and effectively when concerns are raised.

We are also grateful for the constructive feedback that will help us continue to improve. Areas highlighted for further development include support for resilience, confidence and independence, clarity around support in place to help children make progress, and communication regarding bullying and discrimination procedures. We also note the feedback relating to the approachability and support provided by the SENDCo, which will be an important focus for review and improvement.

Compared with last year's survey, we are encouraged to see positive progress in several areas that were previously identified for development. In particular, feedback indicates improved confidence in the school's communication with parents and carers, as well as greater confidence in how concerns raised with the school are addressed. There is also evidence of progress in parents' views of how bullying and discrimination are dealt with. While we recognise that there is still work to do, these findings suggest that the actions taken over the past year are having a positive impact.

As a school, we are committed to strengthening communication with parents and carers, ensuring that families feel well informed about their child's progress and the support available. We will continue to review our systems, including SEND provision and anti-bullying procedures, to ensure that all children and families feel supported and valued.

We are proud of the positive feedback received and are grateful for the ongoing partnership between home and school. Your views are invaluable in helping us maintain high standards while continuing to develop the best possible educational experience for all pupils.
